COURAGE TO CARE

Courage to Care is an educational and social inclusion program. The program inspires participants to take positive action in relation to discrimination in all forms, from the schoolyard to the workplace and beyond. Everyone has the capacity to make a difference and be an upstander.

THE CLASSROOM PROGRAM

Courage to Care in the Classroom is a 90 to 120 minute program for Grades 6 - 12. The program is designed to support the Australian curriculum including HSIE, History, English and PDHPE, emphasizing social justice and enriching mental health and wellbeing.





THE PROGRAM STRUCTURE

- What is Courage to Care? Goals and Aims
- Introductory historical video with a focus on the Rescuers
- The Holocaust Survivor A Living Historian
- The interactive workshop a time to debrief, share feelings and thoughts, and focus on what they can do in their world of school and community to stand up to prejudice, injustice and discrimination
- Closing video and evaluation

PROGRAM OUTCOMES

- Learning from history: lessons learned from the Holocaust have relevance in student's lives today;
- Developing empathy: every individual has the ability to place themselves in other people's shoes, feel what they feel and act with kindness;
- Taking personal responsibility: recognising that each individual is responsible for the choices that they make and have the capacity to make a difference in their communities.

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

TEACHER'S BOOKLET









NEW: UNKNOWN HEROES BOOKLET SERIES
